 Anniversary dates of 'sensational' events such as this one have the potential to attract: vulnerable people to the same location 	with the industry guidance ('Fatality memorials/tributes on the network') should be removed promptly
 to take their lives well-wishers to the site to lay tokens of remembrance 	It may be advisable to alert FOCs and TOCs that have services passing over the crossing that there may be an increased number of people at that location during the day as they mark the anniversary of the deaths.
