Suicide Awareness Alert

This alert has been issued because of specific intelligence relating to suicide activity on the rail network which it is believed may prompt individuals to take their own lives.

Nature of alert:

16 year old school boy took his life at Wivelsfield on 31 July 2014

On 31 July 2014 at 19:30 a 16 year old male took his live by standing in front of a train at Wivelsfield station. The event saw lots of media attention and memorials at the scene.



Anniversary dates of 'sensational' events such as this one have the potential to attract:

- vulnerable people to the same location to take their lives;
- well-wishers to the site to lay tokens of remembrance.

Recommended action:

Consideration should be given to Network Rail, train operator staff or BTP officers visiting the station on the anniversary date of the event to be on the look-out for:

- anyone showing signs of distress or upset particularly early evening. The event took place at 19:30;
- any tokens of remembrance which in line with the industry guidance ('Fatality memorials/tributes on the network') should be removed promptly.

It may be advisable to alert all FOCs and TOCs that have services that pass through Wivelsfield that there may be an increased number of people at that location during the day as they look to mark the anniversary of the death.
