Suicide Awareness Alert

This alert has been issued because of specific intelligence relating to suicide activity on the rail network which it is believed may prompt individuals to take their own lives.

Nature of alert:

A 15 year old girl took her life near Port Sunlight on 10 November 2014

Anniversary dates of 'sensational' events like this have the potential to attract:

- vulnerable people to the same location to take their lives;
- well-wishers to the site to lay tokens of remembrance.

The event was widely reported both locally and nationally in the press and because of the girls age prompts concern even two years after the event that her friends of the time may be particularly emotionally moved on the anniversary of her death.

Recommended action:

Consideration should be given to stakeholder organisations visiting Port Sunlight on the anniversary of the girl's death to look-out for:

- anyone (particularly young people) showing signs of distress or upset around mid-morning. The event took place around 10:30;
- groups/individuals congregating around the station to pay their respects and the potential impact they could have on the safe operation of the railway;
- any tokens of remembrance which in line with industry guidance should be removed promptly.
