 <u>A 17 year old boy took his life at Market</u> <u>Harborough station on 17 November 2015</u> The boy was struck by an East Midlands Trains service at 08:51. The event led to considerable delays and service disruption throughout the day. This Alert has been raised because of the boys age and a known link between anniversary dates of 'sensational' events like this one and their potential to attract: vulnerable people to the same location to take their lives; well-wishers to the site to lay tokens of remembrance. The event was widely reported in the local press. 		 Consideration should be given to stakeholder organisations visiting Market Harborough Station on the anniversary of the boy's death to look-out for: anyone (particularly young people) showing signs of distress or upset around the time of the event (08:51); groups/individuals congregating around the station to pay their respects and the potential impact they could have on the safe operation of the railway; any tokens of remembrance which in line with industry guidance should be removed promptly. The provision of emotional support by Samaritans to customers on the day should also be considered.
