<ul> <li>Nature of alert:</li> <li>On 20 April 2016, a 22 year old male took his life at a bridge by Shirebrook East Junction at around 03:00.</li> <li>This man's mother and grandmother had been murdered by another family member two months prior to him taking his own life. The media were quick to pick up on this which resulted in widespread coverage of the incident across all communications channels.</li> <li>Anniversary dates such as this – because of the nationwide media coverage at the time – have the potential to:</li> <li>attract vulnerable people to the same location to take their own lives</li> <li>attract mourners to the site to hold vigils which may impact upon the safety and operation of the railway</li> <li>trigger memories for rail staff involved in the incident</li> </ul>		<ul> <li>Recommended action:</li> <li>Consideration should be given to Network Rail, staff of operators or BTP officers visiting the location of the incident around the time it took place to be on the look-out for:</li> <li>persons showing signs of distress or upset who may be at risk of suicide, or mourners gathering in an acts of remembrance</li> <li>any tokens of remembrance, which in line with industry guidance should be removed</li> <li>In addition it would be advisable to alert FOCs and TOCs that have services passing through the Shirebrook East Junction area or maintenance staff who may be working there of the likelihood of mourners being in or around the vicinity of it.</li> <li>Managers of staff who may have been involved in the incident or could be affected by its anniversary should look for signs of trauma amongst them and offer support as per their organisation's welfare arrangements.</li> </ul>
